General Description

The ISL9R860PF2 is a Stealth™ diode optimized for low loss performance in high frequency hard switched applications. The Stealth™ family exhibits low reverse recovery current (I_{RRM}) and exceptionally soft recovery under typical operating conditions.

This device is intended for use as a free wheeling or boost diode in power supplies and other power switching applications. The low I_{RRM} and short t_a phase reduce loss in switching transistors. The soft recovery minimizes ringing, expanding the range of conditions under which the diode may be operated without the use of additional snubber circuitry. Consider using the Stealth $^{\rm TM}$ diode with an SMPS IGBT to provide the most efficient and highest power density design at lower cost.

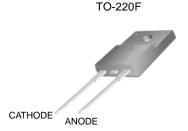

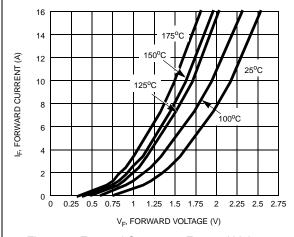


Figure 1. Forward Current vs Forward Voltage

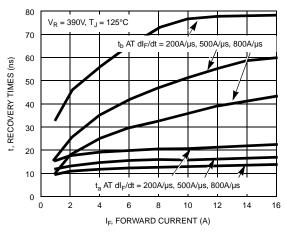


Figure 3. t_a and t_b Curves vs Forward Current

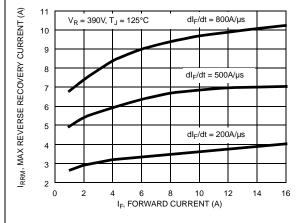


Figure 5. Maximum Reverse Recovery Current vs Forward Current

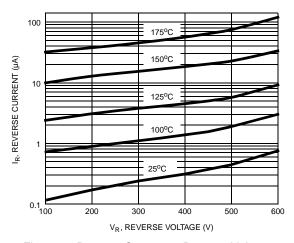


Figure 2. Reverse Current vs Reverse Voltage

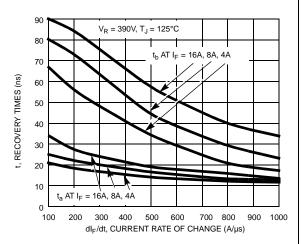


Figure 4. t_a and t_b Curves vs dI_F/dt

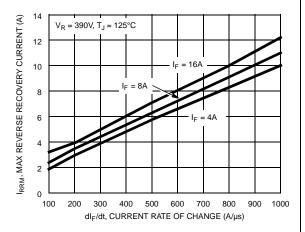
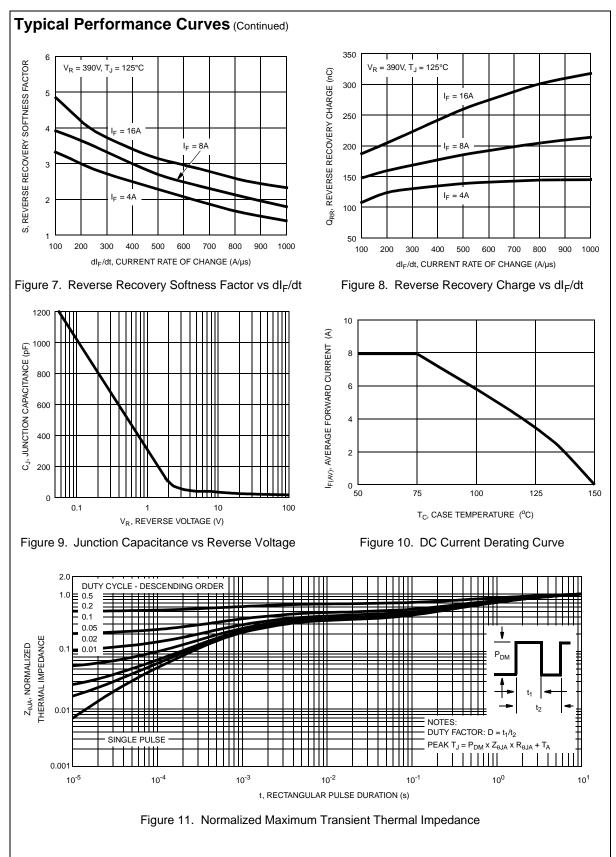


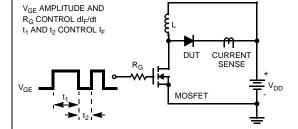
Figure 6. Maximum Reverse Recovery Current vs dI_F/dt

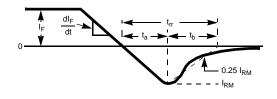


Figure 12. t_{rr} Test Circuit

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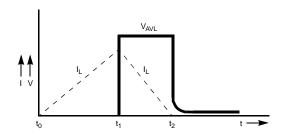


Figure 14. Avalanche Energy Test Circuit
